Breakout Session 4B (PB): Claim Attachment Automation

Using Epic functionality and RPA, this session will describe how The Ohio State University developed a no touch process for claim attachment submission, fully automating the process from ROI WQs to faxing attachments (or sending 275 files) to our payors. This led to reduction of 2 FTEs.

Breakout Session 4C (HB): Denial Mitigation

Marji Karlin & Alison Smith, NYC Health + Hospitals

NYC Health + Hospitals began a denial reduction initiative in mid-2020, then re-launched in earnest in early 2021. They formed teams across all revenue cycle areas, partnering closely with Enterprise Information Systems. By adhering to a schedule of weekly evaluations of top denials it steadily reduced denials from a peak of 27.5 to 9.6 in 10 months.
